REASONS FOR DECISION

REASONS FOR DECISION

The respondent was served with a Notice of Attendance sent by registered mail to the rental premises and confirmed delivered. The respondent failed to appear at the hearing and the hearing was held in his absence.

The applicant alleged that the respondent had breached the tenancy agreement by failing to pay rent and sought an order requiring the respondent to pay the alleged rent arrears and to pay future rent on time.

The applicant provided a statement of the rent account which indicated a balance of rent owing as at February 1, 2006 in the amount of \$1390. The applicant testified that since that date, the March, 2006 and April 2006 rent had come due and no payments had been made, bringing the balance owing to \$1830. The monthly rent for the mobile home lot is \$220.

I find the statement in order and find the respondent in breach of his obligation to pay rent. I find the rent arrears to be \$1830.

An order shall issue requiring the respondent to pay the applicant rent arrears in the amount of \$1830 and to pay future rent on time.
