IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. Pursuant to section 41(4)(a) of the *Residential Tenancies Act*, the respondent shall pay the applicant rent arrears in the amount of one thousand three hundred seventy five dollars (\$1375.00).
2. Pursuant to sections 41(4)(c) and 83(2) of the *Residential Tenancies Act*, the tenancy agreement for the premises known as Apartment 111, 48 Con Road, Yellowknife, NT,

shall be terminated on February 28, 2006 and the respondent shall vacate the premises on that date unless the rent arrears are paid in full.

REASONS FOR DECISION

The respondent was served with a Notice of Attendance sent by registered mail to the rental premises and confirmed delivered. The respondent failed to appear at the hearing and the hearing was held in her absence.

The applicant alleged that the respondent had breached the tenancy agreement by failing to pay rent and sought an order requiring the respondent to pay the alleged rent arrears and terminating the tenancy agreement between the parties unless the alleged rent arrears were promptly paid.

The applicant provided copies of the tenant ledger in evidence which indicated a balance of rent in the amount of \$1375.

I find the ledger in order and find the respondent in breach of her obligation to pay rent. I find the rent arrears to be \$1375. In my opinion, there are sufficient grounds to terminate the tenancy agreement between the parties unless the rent arrears are promptly paid.

An order shall issue requiring the respondent to pay the applicant rent arrears in the amount of \$1375 and terminating the tenancy agreement on February 28, 2006 unless the rent arrears are paid in full.
